*Original outbuildings of a century-old farm have been restored into seven private, spacious and beautiful guest accommodations. Each is appointed uniquely with eclectic furnishings, antiques and often, salvaged building materials. Thirty-five acres of estate vineyards, gardens, creeks, and wildlife provide everything necessary for guests to explore, relax, and return home rejuvenated.*

#### **EDISON HOUSE**

*Friday, Saturday & Sunday \$275 per night ↪ Monday & Thursday \$245 per night, King*

This small building once housed the generator that distributed the power for the farm. This loft-style cottage blends a rustic lodge – big open beams – with sleek retro furnishings. Open and airy, it sits up half a story, where the branches of the trees feel within reach. A stunning ensemble of antique wood windows extends two stories and, in every frame, makes art of the trees. A tiny, sweet gas fireplace warms the room, and the heated basalt floor is kind to bare feet. Venetian plaster is the elegant finishing touch. The tiled bathroom offers an over-sized double shower for sharing. During the day, you may never want to leave your patio, where laziness is encouraged and you just might catch a glimpse of the wild turkeys or a doe with her fawns.

#### **SUMMER KITCHEN**

*Friday, Saturday & Sunday \$295 per night ↪ Monday & Thursday \$265 per night, King*

This two-story cottage will take you back to lazy summer days and a time when preserving the farm bounty was a family endeavor. Now, cook for fun if you choose and take in the views of the property through antique beveled glass picture windows. Up the open staircase is a bedroom over-looking our estate Syrah vineyard and the Blue Mountains to the east. Its tiny veranda offers a perfect vantage point, where you just might be tempted to hold hands and view the stars, or enjoy the sunrise. The pretty, sky-lit bathroom is beautifully tiled and has a claw-foot tub and shower combination. Antiques remind you that butter was once churned by hand and cider was made in wooden basket presses.

#### **LOCUST SUITE**

*Friday, Saturday & Sunday \$295 per night ↪ Monday & Thursday \$265 per night, King*

Slate floors, oriental carpets, and mahogany bar reflect this suite's grand, den-like atmosphere. Curl up on the oversized leather sofa with a good book and light the gas fireplace on a cool morning. This suite is named for the fragrant native trees that grow near the front door and provide mottled shade in the heat of summer. The main living area retains original paneling that documents the repair history of the farm implements and a 1914 trapper's canoe adds definition to the space in a surprising way. A craftsmen style corner kitchen includes all you need to make hors d'oeuvres or a simple, romantic dinner for two. The soaring, tiled shower is spacious for even our tallest guests.

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#### **BUNK HOUSE**

*Friday, Saturday & Sunday \$245 per night → Monday & Thursday \$215 per night, Queen*

You enter this charming little cottage through a trellis covered in meandering clematis vines. The kitchen will remind you of the Forties with its robin's-egg blue cabinets and quaint electric stove. Black and white floor tiles may tempt you to hopscotch your way to a private little patio off the bedroom. The living room features comfortable, overstuffed furniture. The bedroom has a luxurious, four-poster feather bed. Through a glazed antique door salvaged from the old D'Acres hotel is an elegantly tiled bath with a claw foot tub and shower combination. The private brick patio, graced with pretty hydrangeas, peeks out into our Viognier vineyard. Once the house of the farm's hired hand, the Bunk House is now very sweet and cozy for two.

#### **CHICKEN COOP**

*Friday, Saturday & Sunday \$275 per night → Monday & Thursday \$245 per night, Queen*

We promise no rooster will crow at the first rays of sun. Open-beamed ceilings, kitchen, and granite-tiled shower for two disguise this cottage's former life. A dining area overlooks a private garden. This charming cottage really was the chicken coop. A pergola and windows throughout saturate each room with soft abundant light. The well-appointed kitchen will invite you to cook if you wish. An antique beveled glass picture window in the bedroom looks out on to a private brick patio. On a cool evening, a gas fireplace in the bedroom will take away the chill. Time seems to slow down when you are here, so you will have plenty of it for counting the many subtle references to the cottage's namesake.

#### **HAYLOFT SUITE**

*Friday, Saturday & Sunday \$495 per night → Monday & Thursday \$465 per night, King (Additional couple \$100)*

At one time, this space was filled with hay to feed the gentle milk cows that lived below. Now it has been transformed into a spacious, luxurious, one-bedroom, two-bath suite with some of the most fantastic views on the property, and there is a surprise second sleeping area featuring a queen-sized Murphy bed. The architecture features the drama of both high ceilings supported by recycled beams and doors rescued from a fire damaged home. Original hayloft barn doors have maintained their same vigilance for over one-hundred years. The heart of the entire space opens onto a long deck, through multiple French doors that allow the light to stream in. Venetian plaster throughout is beautiful to the eye, and floors filled with radiant heat provide comfort for the feet. On brisk evenings, a pretty gas stove will take away the chill and add a cozy atmosphere for those lazy evenings at home.

#### **CARRIAGE HOUSE SUITE**

*Friday, Saturday & Sunday \$460 per night → Monday & Thursday \$420 per night, Double King*

This two bedroom, two bath suite provides a beautiful living area with kitchen and offers each couple complete privacy. Airy and spacious, the main living area has a garden feel, neatly paneled bead board walls, and an abundance of light. A ground level living area with kitchen is light and spacious opening to a patio perfect for watching the setting sun. In the evening, one couple will climb the stairs to their treetop bedroom with sleigh bed. The adjoining sky-lit bathroom features a luxurious, tiled, oversized shower. The other couple will tuck away in the richly appointed, wood-paneled harness room. Through double doors they will find a claw-foot tub and rain shower in their European styled bath finished with beautiful Venetian plaster.
